County Councillor Steffan Aquarone sent his apologies but no report.

District Councillor Jenny English said that the new chairman of NNDC was District Cllr Nick Coppack and the deputy District Cllr Brian Hanna. The new chairman of NCC was Andrew Proctor.

She also reported that as part of her work on the Task and Finish Group for the review of beach huts and chalets owned by NNDC she and the rest of the group had visited all these on the windiest, wettest, coldest day in May. The group with relevant officers from NNDC were now collating their findings into a report. She had also undertaken training for scrutiny in a day to consider the proposals for the new structure plan.

Beat Manager Graham Gower-Smith sent his apologies and following report: For your info we have had one crime since your last meeting.

Please be aware that we have had attempts made to steal outboard engines in nearby parishes and two thefts from motor vehicles by smashing windows.

Valuables should be out of sight and locked away if possible.

The new snap priority is to assist elderly and vulnerable parishioners with email and letter scams. I aim to hold a few drop in events and will be free to offer advice to anyone. If you have any community events over the next three months that you think would benefit from me being there then please let me know.
